Aghhh what is that?

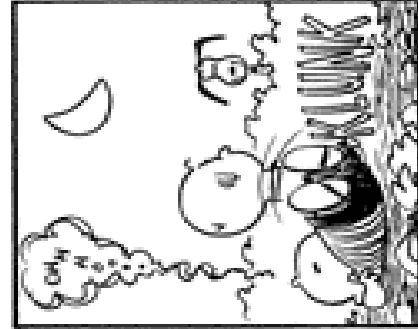
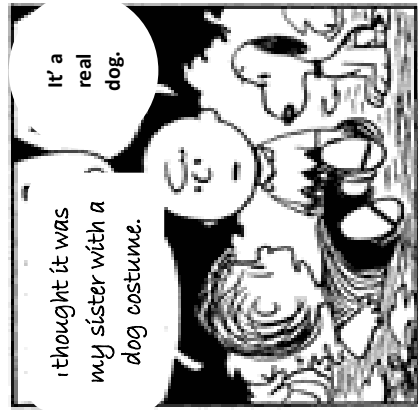
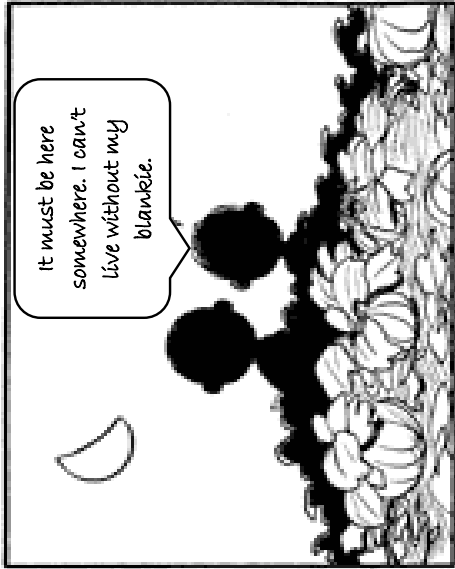
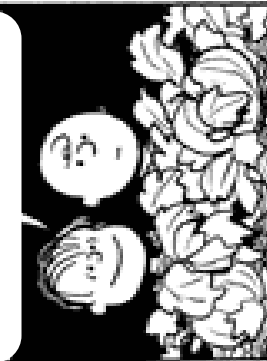
